- Discussion will also include *the Three important components of Computer Forensics (Hardware, Software and Evidence), "Five As of Forensics", Brief overview of the Computer Forensics with respect to Hard Drives, Network Forensics, E-Mail, Internet, and Cell Phones, Hard Drive Geometry (physical vs logical volumes, slack space, unallocated space), Bitstream clone vs bitstream image and when is it best to use one over the other and advantages and pitfalls of each, Most common file types and ways to disguise files or hide evidence, What is hash and why is it important and file signatures and extensions.*
